



EURODAC 2023 ANNUAL REPORT

FACTSHEET DECEMBER 2024

The European Dactyloscopy Database (Eurodac) is the large-scale IT system used for managing asylum applications within the EU and Schengen Associated Countries (EU+).

The system allows fingerprint comparison and storage, and therefore, supports the effective implementation of Regulation (EU) No 604/2013, in determining the Member State responsible for examining an application for international protection lodged in one of the Member States.



In 2023, the performance of the Eurodac Central System met service-level agreements (SLA) requirements. DubliNet met all service-level targets without any downtime.

Out of 31 Member States, 23 (74%) provided input for the customer satisfaction survey in 2023, the lowest participation rate since 2019. Despite the lower response to the survey 99% were "satisfied" or "very satisfied".

SYSTEM UPGRADES



Storage capacity expanded from 7 million to 9 million records

Daily processing ability increased from 15,000 to 24,000

The upgrades became operational in June 2023, successfully completed by 30 November 2023.

System database **software and hardware were upgaded** to align with market standards

Pre-production testing was completed in November 2023 and project was successfully completed on 24 April 2024.

The Agency currently manages Eurodac, SIS and VIS and is in the process of developing new systems: EES, ETIAS and ECRIS-TCN, taking over the management of e-CODEX, the development of the Collaboration Platform for Joint Investigation Teams (JITS), along with developing Interoperability between the systems.
